


September 2018 Stated Meeting



Portland Shrine Hospital Report

The Portland Shriners Hospital recently received the Oregon Business Ethics Award for Non-Profit Organizations. This award is sponsored by the Portland Rotary Club, one of the largest Rotary clubs in the nation. According to Dereesa Reid, Administrator, this award is a reflection of all of the Shriners, physicians, and employees that have served for almost a century in Portland to provide outstanding pediatric orthopedic care. "It is a great honor to be recognized by Rotary International, an organization that upholds service, ethics, and community service," said Ms. Reid.

In other news, Shriners Headquarters announced the "Optimization of C-Fab" operations (Prosthetics and Orthotics) into two locations, Tampa and Portland. These two sites were selected because of the availability of space near a hub airport, history of quality of the existing on-site C-Fab, and other factors. The current fabrication sites that will be consolidated into Portland's new C-Fab West include Salt Lake City, Spokane, St. Louis, Chicago, Pasadena, Northern California, Twin Cities, Portland, and Honolulu. It is anticipated the transition will be complete by January 2019.
