

# **Fortland Shrine Hospital Report**

The Portland Shrine Hospital remains well ahead of last year in terms of inpatient days and surgeries and holding steady on outpatient visits. As of the end of April, 1,291 orthotics and 54 prosthetics have been delivered.

The hospital Public Relations department remains very active with several television spots appearing in the Portland area stations.

Kathy Park was a presenter at the May stated meeting and was asked what kind of fundraising priorities the Portland Shrine Hospital has for the near future. She noted that some of these may be very high cost but a unit, club, or Shrine Center may be able to assist with part or all of one of these items. She offered the following:

#### 1. Reclining Chairs

#### \$8600

Used in the inpatient unit, these recliners have dual uses. They are used to transition our children out of a hospital bed after spine surgery and get them to sit up in a device that can be raised or lowered. It is a treatment chair designed to offer patients and caregivers a comforting and healing experience that is second to none. We need funding for two more chairs, at \$4300 apiece.

#### 2. Child Life has these needs:

#### a. Support for events \$6500

Every year the Child Life group puts on 50 events for our patients. These requested funds would support 50% of the annual costs.

#### b. Funds for gift cards \$3500

Many of our families who bring their children to our hospital for care are from lower economic means. Cash would provide support for gas cards, food, other basic needs to support the families to get to the hospital and sustain them while they were here.

#### c. DVD Players \$1500

Child life specialists at Shriners Hospitals for Children help children and family members cope during procedures. One successful method of distraction for all ages is using portable DVD players. In outpatient clinic during cast applications, children often need to lie on their tummies on the stretchers and hold still. Watching DVD movies helps the patients hold still. During Cast removals the DVD players and headphones jointly help children "tune out" the sound of the cast saw and allow them to focus on a movie instead of the procedure. On the inpatient unit, portable DVD players provide post-op bed rest distraction, and in the day surgery unit they are one of the best ways to help reduce fears of a long wait time before surgery. Often the portable DVD players go with the patient into surgery to help smooth the transition into the operating room. Watching a movie can also make the waiting time for a new prosthesis or orthotic less boring!

We can use 4 portable DVD players for the outpatient clinics, 4 for day surgery, 8 for the inpatient unit and 2 for POPS (Prosthetics and Orthotics).

#### 3. Care Management - Neuromuscular Support Program \$6500

Shriners Hospital for Children — Portland is the only hospital in Oregon that offers a support program for pediatric muscular dystrophy patients and their families. Every month, children with MD and their families, get together to eat and socialize, giving these children the chance to play with other kids just like themselves and for families to connect with one another to share feelings and resources.

The MD support group is a vital outlet for families undergoing difficult circumstances and provides the chance to have fun. Shriners Hospitals for Children — Portland provides this program for families at no cost. Your support can ensure a future for the MD support group at the cost of \$6,500 per year.
