Salt Lake Shrine Hospital Report

I had a wonderful trip to Salt Lake in April, accompanied by Chief Rabban, Garland Risner. We hauled several boxes of items purchased and donated to the Hospital by attendees of the Sand Duners Auction. We first stopped in Wendell and picked up a motorized wheelchair donated by a non-Shriner, Dave Adams. It had never been used and has all the whistles and bells.

The next day, Garland and I attended the Board meeting where we had a presentation from Angel Flight. As you know, our own Assistant Rabban and Portland Hospital rep, Rick Holloway is a Command Pilot for this wonderful organization and flew 34 missions last year. These pilots donate their time and expenses to aid folks in getting care they need when other options are not practical.

Next we had a report from Business development. Jill and Nevah spend their time meeting with Physicians to increase our referrals and doing presentations to create regional managed care partners. They also support our Patient Ambassadors, outreach clinics and screening clinics. They are currently marketing the skills of Dr. McClure, who is a limb discrepancy specialist. Other talking points include cleft lip repair (not palate), and scoliosis treatment and awareness. MJ Miller, our donor relations wizard, is at 26% of goal for the year. She raised over 3 million last year.

Telehealth will soon be available in Las Vegas and El Paso. Elko starts soon. I have been appointed Vice Chair of the plant and facilities committee.

After the meeting, Garland and I visited Kindig-it Design, a customizing car shop and received an autographed rendering of a GTO to be auctioned off at the Barons Car Show. Dave Kindig can be seen on his TV show, called Bitchin Rides.

Next we headed to Hazelton for the North-South Football dinner where we joined Illustrious Sir, Dave Thomas for a hotdog or hamburger while PQ Lady Pam Thomas served the potato salad. The mother of one of the football players named Hunter, gave a heartfelt story of Hunters experience at our Hospital when he was very young. He still has the stuffed animal he received on one of his visits. Thank you El Korah for allowing me to be your representative to this wonderful Hospital system.

Ballroom Mural Restoration By Ray Westmoreland

What began as a project to preserve and restore the beautiful Egyptian themed murals that we all enjoy on the ballroom walls has blossomed into a journey to uncover and restore the full glory of El Korah's artistic past. Did you know that behind the brown paneling that now covers most of the wall area, there are elaborately painted plaster walls, more Egyptian murals and decades of El Korah history?

The project: "Restore the El Korah Ballroom to its past Glory" began after an in depth study by Greg Marsters of Custom Plaster Inc., which involved temporarily removing the wood paneling to expose the decorative painting surrounding the murals. We were thrilled to learn that our history was mostly intact, just hiding behind paneling. With this discovery, El Korah applied for and received a matching grant from the Idaho Heritage Trust of \$7500 toward the interior restoration. It expires in three years so we have to get busy.

Come down today and have a look at what we've found. A section of the paneling has been removed and replaced with a clear piece of polycarbonate in the southeast corner to display the decorative artworks which border the murals.

We invite every member, family member and Boise history buffs to join us on a journey to rediscover the lost art of El Korah. You can help by sending us any photos that shows the ballroom prior to 1970. And you can make a gift to help be part of this legacy project.

The current Divan has approved the project with concerns of timing regarding Treefort and other income producing events.

In addition to the grant money, Lady Carol Yavno has donated \$1400 raised by one of her 2017 fund raisers. Several members of the committee have committed additional funds. 13 Nobles, Ladies, and friends have formed a committee to begin fund raising with Ray Westmoreland and Max Bearden as co-chairs.

The project, which would include returning columns and decorative moldings and removing the dropped ceiling will cost \$500,000. Grants, major donors, and donations from the public and community will be sought.

A Tax Saving Way to Support Shriners Hospital for Children-Portland

We at Shriners Hospitals for Children – Portland are thankful for the support we have received over many decades from El Korah temple as well as the individual personal gifts from many nobles. Given your wonderful past philanthropy, I wanted to share that there is tax saving way for you individually to support the hospital through taking advantage of a Charitable IRA Rollover. If you are 70½ years old or older, there is a simple way to donate to Shriners Hospitals for Children – Portland and receive tax benefits in return. You can give up to \$100,000 per year from your Individual Retirement Account (IRA) directly to a qualified charity - such as ours -without having to pay income taxes on the money. This law no longer has an expiration date so you are free to make annual gifts to our organization this year and well into the future.

Why Consider This Gift?

Your gift will be put to use today, allowing you to see the difference your donation is making. You pay no income taxes on the gift. The transfer generates neither taxable income nor a tax deduction, so you benefit even if you do not itemize your deductions. If you have not yet taken your required minimum distribution for the year, your IRA charitable rollover gift can satisfy all or part of that requirement.

Here is How this Works

If you are 70 ½ years or older, you are required to receive an annual distribution (the required minimum distribution) from your IRA accounts. These distributions are included in your adjusted gross income and are subject to taxation. The Charitable IRA Rollover permits taxpayers to make donations directly to charitable organizations from their IRA without including the distribution in their adjusted gross income. This lessens your annual tax bill by lessening your income.

Distributions from a qualified IRA must be made directly by the IRA's administrator or trustee to a qualified charity (Shriners Hospitals for Children - Portland) or the funds will become a taxable distribution for you.

Here is what you will need to do:

1. Send a written request to your IRA administrator explaining your interest in giving this IRA distribution to the Shriners Hospital for Children - Portland. Inform the IRA administrator to send the check to Shriners Hospital for Children - Portland and not to you; otherwise, you will have to claim it as income. Please contact me, the El Korah Recorder, or a Portland Board member for a copy of a suggested format that you can use for the written request.

2. Please tell your IRA administrator to include whom the payment is from and your contact information, otherwise we may not know the distribution is from you. Too often, we receive checks from an IRA account with Vanguard, Fidelity, Schwab, etc. without any donor name and it is put into a general gift account.

3. The charity must send a written acknowledgement back to you along with receipt for your records.

 If you would like to direct your gift in a specific way, please let the Development Department at Shriners – Portland know of your intent so we can ensure it is designated as you wish.

As with all financial decisions, we strongly advise you to speak with your IRA Administrator and your financial advisor to determine if this option is right for you.
