Nobles, Ladies, and friends, this is not the way any of us planned to spend our springtime-still on a stay at home order with minimal contact with others. The Governor has released his initial plan to slowly reopen Idaho, but all it will take is a resurgence of positive COVID-19 cases for that to get reversed and we

may be back where we are now. On April 27, the Most Worshipful Grand Master of Masons in Idaho Steve Hall stated that he will continue his edict to suspend all Masonic meetings or gatherings to minimize the spread of the COVID-19 virus **until further notice**. While we have no COVID-19 cases in any of the three Idaho state veterans homes, a facility that I visited last fall in Long Island, NY currently has 46 deaths of veterans from the virus. The ease at which this virus is transmitted and its effects on the elderly in particular is nothing to be taken lightly.



Unfortunately, we also had to cancel our 2020 Circus, as every other Temple who planned to host the event had cancelled theirs. Treefort is still on the books for September, but we simply don't know where we will be in reopening group activities at this point.

The Board of Directors, with considerable



assistance and direction from Mary Baldwin, completed an application for a loan through the Payroll Protection Program (PPP) to cover certain costs of the operation of El Korah during this pandemic. Some Nobles have questioned why we kept our employees on staff. The reason is the PPP allows full loan forgiveness for all costs associated with keeping our staff employed instead of using unemployment <u>plus</u> the cost of our utilities. The major costs of El Korah are payroll and utilities, so if we can get these covered under the PPP, we are better off than simply laying off our staff.

To that end, we are also closely monitoring our expenses to be sure we don't go too far underwater this year. We are hopeful that our activities this fall will allow us to come close to covering our expenses. All of the other 2020 Potentates I have talked to feel the same way.

Please continue to practice social distancing, wash your hands repeatedly, and stay home if you are not feeling well. Thank you again for your support of El Korah. We will get through this. Take a few minutes and call your fellow Nobles.

Chief of Staff Recognized

Physician honored as prestigious endowed chair

The chief of staff at Shriners Hospitals for Children - Salt Lake City, Kristen Carroll, M.D., now holds the honor of the Sherman S. Coleman, M.D., Presidential Endowed Chair in Pediatric Orthopaedics in the Department of Orthopaedics at the University of Utah. An endowed chair is a recognition of profound academic distinction and excellence, but what makes this honor even more meaningful is the history behind its name.

Sherman S. Coleman, M.D., was the second chief of staff at the Salt Lake Shriners Hospital while he served as the chair of the University of Utah Orthopaedic Division for 33 years. His contributions to orthopaedics are widely renowned. What's more, he was like a second father to Dr. Carroll, making this recognition incredibly meaningful to her.

As endowed chair, Dr. Carroll will manage a sizable budget for research and professional advancement for five years. She already put some of the funding to good use with the Shriners Hospitals for Children western Regional Research Conference, hosted by our Salt Lake City location in the fall of 2019. She also has professional development plans with some incredible orthopaedic surgeons within the Pediatric Orthopaedic Society of North America (POSNA) and aims to help advance women pursuing careers in orthopaedics.

For more than 20 years, Dr. Carroll has cared for children with neuromuscular and orthopaedic conditions such as cerebral palsy, skeletal dysplasia, osteogenesis imperfecta and developmental dysplasia of the hip at Shriners Hospitals for Children - Salt Lake City. In addition to her role as chief of staff, Dr. Carroll is a University of Utah professor in the Department of Orthopaedic Surgery.

The History of the American Flag

Part 1 by David Bennett, Oriental Guide



Today the American flag consists of thirteen horizontal stripes; seven red stripes alternating with six white stripes representing the original 13 colonies. The stars represent the 50 states of the Union.

The colors of the flag are symbolic as well: Red symbolizes Hardiness and Valor, White symbolizes Purity and Innocence and Blue represents Vigilance, Perseverance and Justice.

The first legislation of the Continental Congress, on October 18, 1775, established a Federal navy, but, as far as is known, without a national ensign. Ships are reported to have been sent to sea under the pine-tree flag or possibly hoisted the colors of their originating State.

Two days later on October 20, 1775, Washington writes to Colonel Glover and Stephen Moyland, "Please fix upon some particular flag, and a signal by which our vessels may know one another. What do you think of a flag with a white ground, a tree in the middle, the motto, "Appeal to Heaven". This is the flag of our floating batteries. We are


fitting out two vessels at Plymouth and when I next hear from you on this subject, I will let them know them know the flag and the signal, that we may distinguish our friends from our foes'.

Dr. Franklin, Mr. Lynch and Mr. Harrison, convening at the camp at Cambridge, were appointed to consider the subject. The result was the retention of the union jack (king's colors) representing the still-recognized sovereignty of England, but coupled to thirteen stripes, alternating red and white in place of the loyal red ensign. This symbolized the union of the thirteen colonies against the tyranny and oppression of Great Britain.

While not known with great certainty, it has been suggested that the origin of the stripes came from the ragtag Continental soldiers. The continental army of 1775 was without uniforms, and cloths of a stripe or ribbon distinguished the different grades. The daily view of these distinguishing marks of rank would naturally represent the United Colonies.

It will probably never be known who designed our union of stars. Neither Congressional records nor the public and private voluminous correspondence or diaries of the time refer to the creation of the stars.

It has been asked why the stars on our banner are five-pointed while, historically, those on our coins have been six-pointed. While there is a wonderful story about Betsy Ross favoring a five pointed star because of it's ease in construction (see further on), the answer is, that the designers of our early coins followed the English, and the designer of our flag the European custom. In the heraldic language of England, the star has six points; in the heraldry of Holland, France and Germany, the star is five-pointed.

The Portland Hospital's visit by the American College of Surgeons (ACS) to be assessed for being able to qualify for ACS Musculoskeletal Certification has been postponed for now. This certification is part of our strategic plan and will further allow us to be part of health systems and insurance networks.
