



Our Public Relations staff has been extremely busy in getting the name and mission of the Hospital into the public view. New patient referrals reached 284 in September, and the fracture clinic saw 47 visits. Both of these are all time records for the Hospital.

The process to be selected to attend a camp is each applicant must write an essay on why they should be selected to attend. Below is an essay submitted for this year's winter camp. She is a patient from the Chicago hospital and attended her first camp this past summer. She writes beautifully the importance of the camp. Enjoy.

Hi my name is Jada and I was born without my right arm. I used to be discouraged and feel alone whenever I said that. But this past summer I got to meet some amazing people that showed me it's ok to have a missing limb. It doesn't make you any less of a person from anyone else. Honestly in a way it gives you another family. I had a life-changing experience at Un-Limb-ited Camp. I got to connect with everyone on a personal level and I still talk to some today. My camp counselors gave me the reassurance I needed to be more confident in myself. And, my peers helped me open up more. I never ever would let my little "rabbit feet" as I like to call them, out and exposed. I would always hide them away in my swimming suit or put on a shirt to conceal myself. But there I felt like I belonged, it felt normal. I was so sad to have to leave camp because it felt so much like home and I had never had an experience like it. And what's even worse is I graduated this past summer. So knowing I can't return back next year to summer camp breaks my heart. But I will never forget that amazing experience, I will forever hold on to my Camp Un-Limb-ited paddle. I hope to be able to go to Winter Camp this coming winter and eventually become a camp counselor myself because Shriner's does so much for children that need specialized care; and I had such great camp counselors, I would love to impact others kids the same way one day. Winter camp is something I really would love to be a part of because I've always wanted to try snowboarding but never had the opportunity to. So this would be such an awesome experience for myself. Also, I wouldn't mind seeing my peers from Summer Camp because I miss them like crazy. Thank you for reading my essay and I hope to hear back soon.
