






### **November 2018 Stated Meeting**

The Portland Shriners Hospital October Board meeting was held in conjunction with several other Hospital Boards in Las Vegas at the annual Shriners Open. A total of 5 Hospital Boards met individually and then collectively to share ideas and network.

The annual Food Drive to the Portland Hospital was on October 20. Once again, the support exceeded all previous years. More than \$440,000 was raised to support the Portland Hospital from several Al Kader clubs and units. A special Thank You to Jay Garrett for his role as Wagonmaster for the Idaho/Eastern Oregon contingent!!

The Portland Hospital continues to increase its year to date referrals for new patients and from physicians. We had a 33 percent increase in the utilization of the walk-in fracture and sports injury clinic in September. Total revenue is very nearly at budget and expenses have been monitored closely as well. Outpatient surgeries is on track to be slightly lower than last year.

We want to thank all of the Nobles for their support of the mission our wonderful staff carries out each day to care for the children!

- 4. Not contain a third party's copyrighted material, trademarks, service marks or other protected material.

In addition, all official Association, Temple, Unit and Shrine Club social media websites and accounts must be accessible to and controlled by more than one administrator. Violation of these guidelines may be considered in determining whether such posts constitute conduct unbecoming a Noble.



# EL KOPAH'S NEW MOSQUE TO BE DEDICATED

Lodge Hold's First Ceremony in Its New Home This Afternoon.

PLANS ARE ELABORATE

Shriners From All South Idaho to Take Part; Dance Big Success.

The newly completed mosque of the El Korah temple of the Mystic Shrine located at Twelfth and Idaho will be dedicated with appropriate ceremonies Saturday afternoon at 4 o'clock. Of course, the ceremonies will not be open to the public.

Officers in charge have been specially deputized for the occasion by Imperial Potentate Dr. Frederick R. Smith of Rochester, N. K. They are Frank G. Ensign, acting imperial potentate; M. A. Regan, acting imperial chief rebban; C. W. Wayland, acting imperial assistant rebban; George C. Huebener, acting imperial high priest and prophet and Albert A. Jessup, acting imperial orator. All of the members of the shrine named above are past potentates of the local temple.

The ceremony will include all the members of the temple, about 525 located in different parts of Idaho south of the Salmon river, with the drum corps and the patrol.

Following the dedicatory exercises a supper will be served in the commodious dining rooms in the basement of the mosque at 6:30 p. m. After this there will be held a ceremonial session at which some 20 candidates will be initiated into the mysteries of the shrine.

The Boise Consistory No. 3, whose right it is to confer the thirty-second degree of Masonry upon those candidates which are ready for that work, has just completed a reunion at which a number of candidates have received the degree. Attending the reunion there are a large number of mystic chriners from all portions of southern Idaho in the city, who will remain over for the dedicatory ceremonies of the new mosque of the local El Korah temple.

#### OPEN WITH DANCE.

Friday evening the beautiful lodge hall was open, when a delightful dancing party was enjoyed. Decorated with large American flags, the handsome little stage set with appropriate scenery and ornamented with palms the lodge hall made an ideal ball room.

It is larger than any other dancing floor in the city with the exception of that at the Elks' lodge, and last evening was filled with dancers. The smart evening gowns of the ladies with the gay red or white fezes of the Shriners, made an exceedingly attractive picture to look upon.
