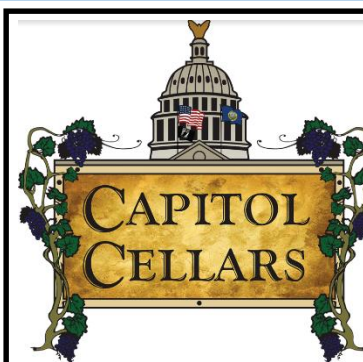

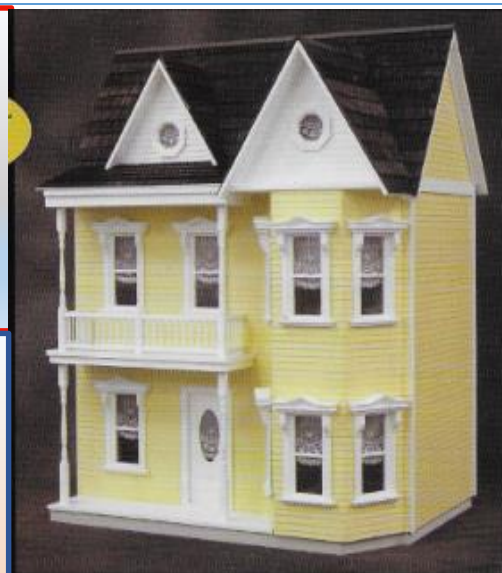

Novices Cross Hot Sands of the Desert
Journey of Hardships and Grief Ended
by Arrival at El Korah Oasis

Sixty-four blistered feet were tucked between the cool sheets at an early hour Sunday morning, testifying to the indisputable fact that their 32 owners had crossed the burning sands of the Desert of Idaho, thereby furnishing great joy to the members of El Korah temple, Mystic Shrine.

To sooth their wounded feelings and aching extremities, as splendid a gathering of representative men as ever donned the red fezzes sat down at 11 o'clock Saturday night to the heavy-laden banquet boards in the Orange room of the Owyhee, crowding those spacious quarters to their utmost capacity, while the good fellowship of the Mystic Shrine reigned supreme. . . . Illustrious Potentate Charles W. Wayland presided.

The successful ceremonial opened at Masonic hall at 3 o'clock with a business session, which was followed at 4 p.m., by the first section of the journey across the blazing desert. At 8 o'clock, the second and third sections occupied at the Natatorium and the magnificent banquet at 11 o'clock closed the ceremonial.
