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



Some History of El Korah TempleBy Mitch Davis

The original building at twelfth and Idaho was a stone livery stable designed by J. E. Tourtellotte and Co for George V. Leighton. In the Idaho Statesman dated January 5, 1908, we read "It is claimed by the people informed in such matters that Boise has the largest and best equipped building for livery stable purposes in the Pacific Northwest, in the stone building constructed by George V. Leighton at the corner of Idaho and Twelfth streets. It has a high basement story partially above ground, nine foot ceilings, cement floors, and has stalls for 100 head of horses in the basement, divided into single, double and box stalls.

The main floor contains a carriage room 50 by 122 feet clear and open without a post. On the side of this room is the office, baggage room, waiting room, harness room, harness shop, etc. On the floor above, which is serviced by an elevator, there is a large paint shop for carriages, also grain bins, and hay loft. The building cost \$16,000." From a photograph taken by Harvey Studio of Boise in 1911 from the roof garden of the Owyhee Hotel, (which was published in "Imperial Boise" a brochure distributed by the Illustrated Idaho Company of Boise, Idaho), we can see the Leighton Livery Stable had a gambrel roof with parapet gables. It was five bays wide with a central Idaho Street entrance. On the east side running the full length of the building we can see a wooden lean to, possibly for the accommodation of animals or hay or straw. On the night of October 1, 1913, the stables with approximately 55 head of horses, 100 horse drawn vehicles, burned leaving only stone walls and gable Ends standing. A photograph of the fire shows shouldered depressed arches on Idaho and Twelfth Streets; these are the main ground story entrances to the stable. According to the cover story in the Idaho Statesman on October , 1913, there is an alley entrance for the basement, a steep ramp made of concrete. Within a week of the fire all the debris had been cleared away and the front wall torn down. The building inspector gave his permission to use the side wall, which were not injured by the fire, in subsequent construction. On June 26, 1914 a building permit was issued to El Korah Temple to construct a \$12,000 building in the site of the livery. The original basement was reused by the Shrine, and the two stone walls as well. The contract for construction was awarded to Carl Prouty and the architect was Charles W. Wayland, both prominent members of the Shrine. In 1928, a second Idaho Street entrance was added (as part of a new 4 bay wing). The new doorway was an exact replica of the original mosque.

The El Korah Shrine Mosque, whose jurisdiction covers the whole of Idaho north of Salmon City and Riggins, was only a 17 year old body when the Mosque was built, but for Masons it was the most elect social center in the state. It's Potentate Ball and ceremonials were gatherings to behold. The Shriners wore full-dress suits, tails and all. They came in fancy carriages, stepped out under a fancy sidewalk marquis with a doorman to assist the ladies in alighting. Huge potted palms adorned the entryway, upon with a velvety carpet was spread to keep the ladies' flowing skirts from touching the sidewalk.

The Board of Governors was able to show their appreciation to the wonderful staff at the Hospital by cooking and serving a barbecue lunch to all staff. Emeritus member Ralph Jubb returned to make his famous burgers, and it provided the Board members to personally thank the staff for the wonderful work they do!



Salt Lake Shrine Hospital Report

This report is for September and October. We have hired Marie Prothero as Director of Patient Care Services and Nathan Clark as Director of Development. Marie replaces Gail, who retired to move to St George. MJ Miller was stolen from us by Imperial. She is now a regional director and has moved to Las Vegas. Nathan is replacing her.

We again have been reminded of the only way to describe how we provide services. All Care and Services are provided regardless of ability to pay." DO NOT say "free," no cost, no charge, or "without financial obligation."

We are working on our Strategic Plan for the next 5 years. Things we know now are that 80% of our patients are within 186 miles of the Hospital, come from 32 states and 11 countries. Unmet needs include treatment for ADHD, Behavioral issues, anxiety and depression and autism. Autism affects 1 in 50 in Utah. One of our strengths is we have the "heart" to cover leftover services. Our reputation continues to grow as we are now a "Most Trusted Brand". We have 150,000 donors. In 2014, donations were \$5 million. By 2017, donations hit \$40 million. Daughters of the Nile have given SLC \$88,000 and \$64 million over the years to all our Hospitals

A big reason for our increase in fund raising is our Patient Ambassador Program. Our patients who wish to may apply to be one. Alec, the star of our nationals Ads is one. All the kids who participate in the Walk for Love are approved through this process. Mikhala from Meridian just attended Carats for Caring and spent the evening getting "grandmothered" by a covey of Shrine Ladies. Patient Ambassadors can be available for Screening Clinics, Stated meetings or other events. Our Walk for Love events are the perfect time to connect with our patients. Sixty-Fourth Annual Eastern Oregon Food CaravanBy Jay Garrett

This year's annual event leaves Ontario, Oregon from the Walmart parking lot on October 20 at 7:00 am. Each of the last two years saw more than \$300,000 per year donated to the Portland Shrine Hospital, which represents more than 60% of the annual foodservice operating budget. Patient meals are served in a room service style, allowing the patient to order what they want. The cafeteria serves between 250 and 300 meals per day Monday through Friday. The frozen meat donations through the Caravan comprise 85% of the protein needs of the hospital each year.

The first stop of the Caravan is Baker City, and in each town along I-84 we stop and tour through town to advertise the Shrine. Lunch is served in Hermiston with the arrival of the Al Kader Temple at 4:15 pm PST. It is always fun to meet and mix with the Shriners of Al Kader and Hillah Shrine Temples.

There are 30 rooms reserved at the La Quinta Inn in Wilsonville, which is easy walking distance to Al Kader Temple. To make a reservation, make sure to request the Shrine rate. Their number is 503-682-3184.
