### From the Idaho Statesman, May 16, 1901

EL KORAH TEMPLE Ceremonial Session Held in This City Yesterday Sixteen New Members Initiated- Banquet Served at the Capitol, Participated in by Sixty of the Sons of the Desert

The annual session of El Korah Temple, Ancient Order of the Mystic Shrine, was held in this city yesterday. The travel-worn denizens of the desert pitched their tents for a day in the City of the Plains. Here they ate and made merry, greeting friends and feeding them salt. The camels, too, and all other living animals of the great caravan were regaled. An oasis of never-ending delight it proved to them, with none to say them nay.

At sunrise the devout Shriners knelt in silent adoration–it was the only moment of the day when they were still. After devotions they gathered under the purple tent of the high chief and listened to his words of wisdom, and the records of the scribes. The affairs of state were suborned to the necessities of the Shriners, who were allowed to occupy the legislative chamber for their deliberations. They were in session throughout the day, and the night waned dim ere the close of deliberation. Many novices were initiated.

In the early evening, the Shrine gave a variegated and interesting parade. The line was formed on Jefferson street in front of the capitol, with Noble James A Pinney as guide, and with the Columbian band furnishing music. The costumes were elaborate in many cases and the effect was picturesque. A number of the novices were roped and led along at the tail end of the procession. The line of march was down Jeserson [sic] to Tenth, on Tenth to Main, on Main to Fifth, countermarch on Main and then back to the state house, where the evening session was held. There were fireworks at the Overland hotel, also on Main street, at the corner of Seventh.

At the evening session 16 novices were initiated. The work of the Shrine was concluded at the 11 o'clock, and the members, 60 in number repaired to the Capitol hotel, where a fine banquet had been spread for them. ....

Potentate Reed, as the master of ceremnies [sic], sat at the middle of this second table, where he could look straight down the other. After the viands had been disposed of and cigars distributed, a number of the nobles were called on by the grand potentate, and responded with witty and entertaining remarks. All of them took occasion to speak of the resources of the northwestern country and also of the advantages of Masonry.
