
## Carats for Caring

It is a "Girls Night Out" event to raise camp funds for teens to attend the camp and will be held Friday, September 21, 2018 from 5:30 to 8 PM at the El Korah Shrine Center, 1118 W. Idaho, Boise, ID.

The Un-Limb-ited camps are for teen patients of Shriners Hospitals for Children living with limb loss or deficiency. These camps offer a unique opportunity for teens to gain confidence and form strong bonds with other amputees while learning either adaptive skiing and snowboarding or whitewater river rafting and camping in the Utah wilderness. Patients from any of the Shriners Hospitals for Children are eligible to attend camp. There is no cost to participate in this camp. Camp covers individualized instruction, equipment, food, lodging and activities for the duration of the camp. There is a summer camp and a winter camp.


