Portland Shrine Hospital Report

As many of you know, the Portland Shriners Hospital is located in Multnomah County, which has been in the most restricted risk level for COVID since March 2020. While the risk assessment has moved to the "moderate" category, hospitals are still not allowed to add capacity or increase visitation. At this point, only one parent and no siblings may accompany patients in the hospital. The Board continues to meet electronically but we hope to have limited in-person meetings beginning in the next few months.

On Thursday, July 1 at 7 pm MDT, the Portland Shriners Hospital will host a virtual Hospital Day! Watch for information on how to participate in this event.

With the increased emphasis on virtual examinations for patients, the Portland Shriners Hospital has been selected as one of four SHC sites to pilot a new telehealth clinical platform called ViTel Net. This will include telehealth visits for new and existing patient appointments, pre- and post-surgery appointments, and rehabilitation services.

Included in this issue of the Desert Dust is the 2020 Infographic which provides several key metrics which you will find interesting. It also emphasizes the scope of work being done at the Portland hospital.

On Saturday, June 26-Sunday, July 4, we will be hosting a virtual Stroll, Roll, & Shine! More information will be sent soon on this great way to support the Portland Hospital.

Salt Lake Shrine Hospital Report

Talks continue about merging with Primary Children's Hospital.

Donations are at 46% of goal for the year. We received a million dollar donation from an anonymous donor. He is presenting as an honor to 2 past Potentates of El Jebel in Denver. We also received \$42000 from Jackson Hole Shrine club Cutter Races. This is a must see event if you want some intense racing.

In addition, we have over 6000 donors who are giving \$250 or more. The cost to market for these donations amounts to 8 cents per dollar raised which is the envy of the Shrine system. We also received \$133,102 in gift-in-kind donations. We are currently replacing 32 TV's which were also donated. Please remember to use Amazon Smile when ordering from them.

Pops: Overall, we are \$102,587 under budget. Our location has the highest collections and the third highest visits in the system even though deliveries are down by 20% due to Covid. We are collecting 38%. We sent 48 devices to Portland, mostly ankle or foot orthotics. Dr. Carroll congratulates our staff for going above and beyond to care for our patients special needs. This month, they made specialized fingers so a child could hold their horse reins, a specialized hand for a competitive moto-crosser, a specialized foot for a ballet dancer and a specialized ski foot for a racer. What creativity!

Clubfoot: Springtime brings more babies and our four clubfoot clinics that happen every week are bustling! Jaime Manning PA, DR Woiczik, Dr. Hennessey, and Dr Holmes have been busy casting lots of babies! Our clubfoot clinic is busier than Iowa now.. it is a real jewel in our service line. We are indebted to the vision of our female surgeons for creation of such a successful clinic that has helped families. One of our current University of Utah residents is the father of one of these children, and was so incredibly complimentary of our service. His experience with Dr. Hennessey inspired him to become an orthopedic surgeon.

Other notes: Jill Connor, who many of us know and who is so much help when support is needed by our Temple for literature, clinics etc., has now been with us 10 years. Congratulations and many thanks!

Hunter Woodall (Blade runner) will be graduating from the University of Arkansas and is turning pro. He is currently training for the Paralympics.

El Korah sent 107 kids (256 visits) to Salt Lake last year, second only to Utah.

Shriners Hospitals for Children has received a four star rating as a non-profit. Thank you for supporting our Hospitals!






