

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Portland Shrine Hospital Report

For the first time in a year, some of the Board of Governors for the Portland Shriners Hospital finally were able to meet in person! While many restrictions are still in place for visiting health care facilities, a plan was in place to protect our patients by making sure all visitors were vaccinated, proper PPE was worn, and no Board members passed through patient care areas. We look forward to more Board members attending in person in the future.

Inpatient days and procedures were down slightly in March but so far in April these metrics have improved. Outpatient procedures continue to improve. The number of unique patients is projected to be over 40 percent above budget for 2021. While overall operating metrics for Portland are 4th to 6th in the system, net patient revenue continues to be second only to Northern California.

On Thursday, July 1 at 7 pm MDT, the Portland Shriners Hospital will host a virtual Hospital Day! Watch for information on how to participate in this event.

A Temple Relations Committee has been formed so that at least one Board member will have direct and regular contact with each of the nine Shrine Temples that supj the Portland Hospital.

Please make sure to check if you are in the correct zone. As for the parking lot directly behind the building during the day (between 6:00 am and 6:00 pm) it is run by Car Park. After 6:00 pm Monday through Friday, and on the weekends, it is run by the City. From the information that we have currently, the city will not be enforcing the lot. This information is subject to change at any moment so park there at your own peril. If you are ticketed for using that parking lot, it will be your responsibility and not the Shrine's to pay. There is also the parking lot to the South of the building which is owned by Republic Parking. I believe is \$5.00 to park there. If you have any questions you can call the Recorder's Office.

Within the building. Brother Brown's Underground (which was in the Statesmen) and the Oasis have been running smoothly. Brother Brown has the restaurant open Tuesday through Saturday from 11:00 am to 6:00 pm with a special last Sunday church brunch. The Oasis is open Tuesday through Friday from 4:00 pm to 8:00 pm. There have been a number of nights with live music. Brother Brown has had the last few Fridays packed with guests and two great groups providing music for the evening. There is also a Fellowship Night happening on most Tuesdays with the last Tuesday of the month having live music as well. 


shop so we could work inside out of the rain.
