Chaplain's Corner

What is the lesson we have learned from our Blue Lodge experiences and further developed from being a Shriner or Mason?

True brotherhood is one of the most powerful forces in the world. And

it's something the world greatly needs. Jesus showed us what brotherhood really is by doing three different things:

- Loving his "brothers"; The best definition of true brotherhood that I've heard is what Jesus told his disciples: "Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends" (John 15:13). And he followed his own words. He laid down his life for all of us. We have made some very strong commitments in our obligations during our Travels through the 3rd degree. We might not like taking a bullet, but some of us would for sure. America's Brothers in Arms have done that for generations. We should always cherish that feeling of complete commitment to your "brothers" and friends . . . that you would do anything for them.
- 2) Respecting everyone.
- 3) Bringing out the best in everyone.

Loving His Brothers. Jesus proved to us that if you really love your friends, you will do anything for them, even if it includes dying for them. That is what brotherhood is to me.

Respecting Everyone. Jesus had such a tight brotherhood with his disciples that during the last evening they spent together before he was arrested and killed, he washed his disciples' feet. Even though Jesus was considered greater than his disciples because he was their teacher, he washed their feet as if they were greater than he was. This showed

tremendous respect and love for them. This is a humbling example of how Jesus was so unselfish! If Jesus washed his disciples' feet, **what should we be doing for each other?**

After he had washed their feet he explained what he was trying to teach them: (John 13:12-17 NIV)


"Do you understand what I have done for you?" he asked them. "You call me 'Teacher' and 'Lord', and rightly so, for that is what I am. Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet. I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you. Portland Shrine Hospital Report

The Portland Shrine Hospital is continuing to expand our footprint in the Pacific Northwest to meet the mission of proving care for more kids in more places. A huge amount of effort has come to fruition in the opening of our outpatient clinic in Medford, OR called Shriners Children's Medford Clinic. Other outreach opportunities are also being looked at.

Operationally, our average length of stay has dropped this year over last, primarily due to a decreased number of Halo kids as well as getting kids home as quickly as possible so they can recuperate there. Rehospitalizations have not increased and as a result, patient satisfaction scores remain very high. Inpatient census is increasing as we admit more international patients, and outpatient visits are higher than budget. As a result, net patient revenue remains second only to Northern California while the draw on the endowment continues to drop. The walk in fracture clinic continues to grow in excess of budget as well.

For the second year in a row, the Portland hospital has earned the Press Ganey Pinnacle of Excellence Award! This award recognizes top performing health care organizations for the achieving high levels of excellence in patient experience, employee engagement, and physician engagement. Congratulations to the Portland Team for this well deserved honor!

A physician liaison position was approved for Portland to have a more substantial presence in the Seattle market.

While we do not have any new Board members starting this January, there will be five open positions beginning in 2023. Interviews for the Board positions will take place next spring. I will be sending out a letter to all nine Shrine temples in our catchment area seeking Nobles who wish to make a direct difference in the governance of a Shrine hospital. If you have any questions about the Portland Hospital or are interested in serving on the Board, please contact one of the current Board members (Dave Triplett, Mike Mastropaolo, and myself).


