





Portland Shrine Hospital Report

The Portland Shrine Hospital is excited about 2022 following a very successful 2021. Although COVID continues to impact the hospital and health care in general, there are many strategic initiatives in place to continue our positive trajectory on several operational parameters.

First, we are preparing for our Joint Commission survey which will occur during 2022. The Joint Commission is a private entity which surveys hospitals for compliance with federal regulations, and the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) allows that survey to qualify for a recertification survey for licensure by the states. Therefore, it is critical that we successfully pass this survey. One of the key parameters of maintaining licensure is to have an average daily census (ADC) of at least two inpatients. Fortunately, we have been consistently meeting that core requirement. Other requirements include appropriate policies and procedures in place for quality improvement, environmental services, and virtually all aspects of patient care.

Second, we continue to grow our clinic in Medford and the fracture clinic in the hospital.

Third, our affiliation with OHSU is a key part of our future growth as we utilize their pediatric intensive care unit for patients needing advanced life support. Fourth, we received approval from Tampa on the addition of a new spine surgeon to replace two surgeons who are retiring.

Fifth, we continue communication with Spokane, Salt Lake City, and the Pasadena clinic to handle any potential referrals, especially international patients, in order to care for more kids including those from outside the United States.

Finally, we are looking to become certified by the American College of Surgeons (ACS) in orthopedic surgery during 2022. We were on line to have that certification completed in 2020 but COVID caused that effort to be delayed.

I gave a presentation at PNSA on the Portland Hospital and it sounds like it was well received. The presentation had to be done virtually due to the continued high positivity and transmission rates of COVID which I could not chance bringing back to the Boise veterans home. A special thank you is in order for Noble Juan Maso, Assistant Rabban for Bagdad Shrine, for his expertise in setting up the remote link.

Our physicians continue to have medical papers published and are asked frequently to present at a variety of professional seminars. It is a significant credit to our physicians, our hospital and the Shrine system to have surgeons who are nationally and internationally recognized as top performers in the pediatric orthopedic surgery and research fields.

Letters were sent to all nine Shrine temples in the Portland service area requesting nominations for Nobles wishing to serve the Portland Hospital as a member of the Board of Governors next year. If you are interested in applying to be on the Portland Board of Governors, please contact the Recorder's office or me and one of us can send you a packet. If you have any questions about the Portland Hospital or are interested in serving on the Board, please reach out to one of the current Board members (Dave Triplett, Mike Mastropaolo, and myself).

Chaplain's Corner

With Ann and I returning from Mexico on March 16th, let's look at the following special day, the 17th of March which is the annual celebration of St. Patrick's Day. This holiday honors Saint Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland. Patrick lived in the 5th century and is credited with bringing Christianity to the country of Ireland.

Saint Patrick was born Maewyn Succat around 385 A.D. Succat in Britain to parents who were nobility citizens of Rome. When Maewyn was a 16 years old teenager, he was kidnapped by pirates and spent the next six years enslaved as a shepherd boy in mountains of Ireland.

Inspired by spirit dreams, Maewyn eventually escaped and returned to Britain where he later became a priest. He took the name of Patrick when he was ordained.

Patrick returned to Ireland to share his faith with the people there. The shamrock, or three-leaf clover, is associated with his inspiration to convert the Irish into Christians. Saint Patrick used the shamrock to explain the Holy Trinity, with each leaf representing the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The three leaves of a shamrock are also said to stand for faith, hope, and love which are the three principal rounds of Jacob's ladder. The fourth leaf is where we get the luck from as in the song "I'm Looking Over a Four-Leaf Clover", etc.

Leprechauns and the color green are also associated with St. Patrick's Day, but unlike the shamrock, they have nothing to do with Saint Patrick. However, Leprechauns are recognized as symbols of Ireland.

The snake myth issue is for another lesson.

Lesson in review:

- 1. Let the shamrock keep a prayer in your heart for the love and blessings of the Trinity.
- 2. Faith in God,
- 3. Hope of immortality
- 4. Love, the essence of God toward all mankind.
- 5. The Shamrock's fourth leaf represent Luck and occurs when Preparation meets Opportunity

Common ways to celebrate St. Patrick's day includes the "wearing o' the green" to avoid being pinched and eating foods associated with Ireland, such as soda bread, corned beef and cabbage, and potatoes. People may also dye their hair, foods, and drinks green for St. Patrick's Day. Even the Chicago River is dyed green each St. Patrick's Day!






