Shriners Childrens - SLC is very grateful to the Cameleers of El Korah for starting a Shriners fund raiser benefitting the adaptive bike program at Salt Lake City. Utah, Wyoming, and Colorado already have fund raisers that bring in thousands to benefit our Kids with wheelchairs, prosthetics, rehab and many other things.

El Korah does a great job of providing travel assistance to our patients, but does not send any money to the hospitals. Our East West football game adds to our travel fund and is the only charitable fund raiser we have. We are very grateful to the Elite Blacklight Patrol, the Provost Guard, Gold Rush, Greeters, Sand Duners, Twin Falls Shrine Club, Snake River Shrine club, Tin Lizzies and several other clubs and units who occasionally make donations to our hospital programs. The Baron's Car Club, through the El

Korah Classy Car club, ended their charitable event due to the building construction next door to El Korah. Over 5 years, they averaged almost \$20,000 in annual donations.

We hope every club and unit starts a fund raising page to support this Biking for Kids event. We are glad to hear that the Provost Guard and the Players are excited to help.

Portland Shrine Hospital Report

It has been another busy month for Shriners Children's Portland! We filled some key positions in the hospital with leaders hired in marketing, human resources, and donor development. The labor market in Portland is as tight as it is in the Boise area and we are lucky to have hired some highly talented individuals to these positions.

The new Medford clinic is still exceeding expectations in operational metrics. Additionally, the outreach clinic in Bellingham, WA has resumed. We just hired a new physician liaison for the Seattle area and expect to have referrals increase from the northern I-5 corridor. The fracture clinic continues to grow beyond budget and above last year's totals. We expect this venture to continue to grow as more and more people are recognizing Shriners as the place to be to take your kids.

Several other metrics are showing improvement at the Portland hospital. Referrals are increasing over 2021 levels as well as the number of new patients and the surgical wait list. Our revenue remains strong and draw on the endowment remains at the low levels we experienced in 2021.

In addition to preparing for our Joint Commission on Accreditation of Health Care Organizations (TJC) survey as mentioned last month, we are also working on certification from the American College of Surgeons. This was originally planned to happen in summer 2020 but COVID prevented the certification review from happening.

We are nearing the deadline for Nobles wishing to serve the Portland Hospital as a member of the Board of Governors next year to submit their applications. A letter has been sent out to all nine Shrine temples in our catchment area seeking Nobles who wish to make a direct difference in the governance of a Shrine hospital. If you have any questions about the Portland Hospital or are interested in serving on the Board, please contact one of the current Board members (Dave Triplett, Mike Mastropaolo, and myself).

Chaplain's Corner

Mother's Day celebrations go back to ancient times when Greeks and Romans held festivals in honor of the mother goddesses Rhea and Cybele. However, the early Christian festival known as "Mothering Sunday" stands as the modern precursor. This European tradition fell on the fourth Sunday in Lent. Many believed the faithful would return on this day to their "mother church"— the main church near their home — for a special service.

The Mothering Sunday tradition shifted over time into a more secular holiday where children would give their mothers flowers and other gifts. This custom would blend into American Mother's Day in the 1930s and 1940s.

American author Anna Jarvis and poet Julia Ward Howe, who wrote "The Battle Hymn of the Republic" lobbied to make Mother's Day a national holiday — urging prominent Americans to join the effort. By 1912 many states, towns, and churches had adopted Mother's Day as an annual event. Jarvis also started the Mother's Day International Association.

President Wilson would soon establish the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day in 1914. Hallmark began selling Mother's Day cards in the early 1920s. Jarvis' love affair with the holiday she worked so hard to start, did not last, and she eventually grew to resent its commercial appeal.

Of the many key Mothers of the Bible, I selected Jochebed, the mother of Moses, Aaron, and Miriam. She is one of the underappreciated mothers in the Bible, yet she also showed tremendous faith in God. To avoid the mass slaughter of Hebrew boys, she set her baby Moses adrift in the Nile River hoping that someone would find him and raise him. God so worked that her baby was found by the Pharaoh's daughter. Jochebed even became her own son's nurse, ensuring that Israel's great leader would grow up under the Godly influence of his mother during his most formative years.

God used Moses mightily to free the Hebrew people from their 400 year bondage to slavery and take them to the Promised Land. The writer of Hebrews pays tribute to Jochebed (Hebrews 11:23) showing that her faith allowed her to see the importance of saving her child's life so that he might, in turn, save his people.

Although little is written about Jochebed in the Bible, her story speaks powerfully to the mothers of today.
