Portland Shrine Hospital Report

This summer has been busy for the Portland Shrine hospital!

The Medford clinic continues to exceed budget on the number of visits, and we have submitted a proposal to start a clinic in Vancouver, Washington. The fracture clinic continues to set records on the number of new patients seen through the clinic. A new sports medicine program is being developed which will be staffed by Dr. Bayomy, who comes to us from the Springfield hospital. We are projected to exceed the number of inpatient days, outpatient visits, and referrals over last year. All of this is being done while decreasing our case mix adjusted cost per adjusted patient day from last year. The Portland hospital remains second only to Northern California in total net patient revenue. Additionally, we have been caring for more international patients at the Portland hospital over last year.

In July, we held interviews for several Board positions which will be coming open in December of this year. Several very qualified candidates applied and we will submit the names of those who we recommend to serve on the Board of Governors to the Imperial Nominating Committee. They will give us the final approvals for Board positions to begin on January 2023 in early December.

The Portland Hospital will be holding a Virtual Hospital Day on September 23 at 6 pm PDT. More information on this event will be forthcoming. If you are interested in finding out more about the hospital and how it operates, you don't want to miss this event!

Our September Board meeting will be postponed until the following week and will be held in Las Vegas to coincide with the Shrine Hospital Open. This is always a good opportunity to present the successes of the Portland Hospital with the Imperial Board of Directors and Board of Trustees.

We continue to maintain preparedness for our Joint Commission survey as well as working toward being accredited by the American College of Surgeons.

Several of us from the Portland hospital attended the Imperial Leadership meeting in Tampa on August 22-24. It is always good to interact and network with our counterparts in the other Shrine hospitals and health care delivery models. We are continuing to build on meeting the goal of "more kids in more places with the highest quality and lowest cost."

If anyone has any questions about the Portland Hospital, please reach out to me, Dave Triplett, or Mike Mastropaolo. We have all served on the Board for several years and will provide any additional information you may have regarding the Portland Hospital.

El Korah Shrine supported the American Legion Post 100 for the last twelve years, where they met monthly in the Tiger Room. Post 100 was initiated by several Nobles wanting to bring comradery to those who served in the Armed Services — those who have "been there, done that".

Not surprising, even to this day there are a large percentage of Nobles that have proudly served our Nation in a time of conflict. Nobles who are Past Commanders of Post 100 include: Wayne Foster, Dick Swift and Elsworth Barrington. Nobles who are or were members of Post 100 include: Charlie Bull, Bruce Drewes, Hal England, Bob Finney, Mark Isserman, Mark Scott, Bob Stevenson, and many others.

In 2020, the COVID pandemic stifled participation and unfortunately, our numbers dwindled to little to no participants and thus we did not have a quorum for our stated meetings. Many other American Legion Posts within the Treasure Valley suffered the same demise.

In order to solicit larger number of participants to meet the quorum requirements, two Boise Post, the American Legion Post 2 and Post 100 merged and will be known as Post 2. About 100 members from Post 100 and 240 from Post 2 (340 total) now belong to Post 2, which is the John Regan American Legion Post 2.

2nd Lt John Morgan Regan, 128th Infantry, Company D was a young Idahoan who was killed-in-action in WWI for "going over the top" while leading his troops in France and was awarded the Distinguished Service CrossJohn Regan is interred at Morris Hill Cemetery.

The newly merged Post 2 met for the first time on 21Jul22 at El Korah Shrine. This is an exciting time as new opportunities are endless and upon us for growth and to support veterans, their families, and our community. The merger of Post 100 into Post 2 has brought new comrades together with new ideas and comradeship.

Post 2 strongly supports the eight points of the "Veteran's Creed "and seeks to continue to make a difference in our community and across our country.



Salt Lake Shrine Hospital Report

The Board teleconferenced on August 29, 2022. Our leadership had just returned from their conference in Tampa. We are celebrating our 100th birthday soon and we have cause for celebration! We set records in 2021 in Kids seen(encounters) and fund-raising which supports our goal of "More Kids in More Places." We were able to do this as running our health system now costs over a billion a year. Seven locations have now transitioned to clinics. Our Salt Lake clinic was fourth in the number of encounters in the clinics.

Our international reach continues to grow with over 1,000 kids from Mexico needing our help. Staffing is national problem for all locations. Nathan Clark, our Donor Relations leader was recognized by Imperial leadership as the model of success. He will raise over \$4,000,000 this year. Nathan emphasized how important "boots on the ground" is to fund-raising. He recognized proud supporters as examples: the Cameleers of El Korah, the Jackson Wyoming Rodeo and Salt Lake's Kruiser Kids.

The Walk for Love is September 16th at the Hogle Zoo in Salt

Lake. Watch for information in the Desert Dust.

Our Standard Bearer for this year's Shriners Children's Open in Las Vegas is David. When David was nine, he was diagnosed with bone cancer. Treatment was successful but affected his left leg. His parents brought him to Shriners where the surgeons performed a rotation plasty. They removed the affected portion of the upper leg

and replaced it with the healthy portion of the lower leg and rotated that portion 180 degrees. A specialized prosthetic was then designed for him. David now snowboards, swims, and drives a stick shift vehicle. As our organization continues to change to keep up with a changing world, it is great to be reminded of all the good we do for a lot of children with the help of a lot of great people.
