Salt Lake Shriners Children's Report

I attended my first Board of Governors meeting in Salt Lake City last month, along with Ill. Sir Ray Westmoreland. This is Ray's last year serving on the Board of Governors. Members are encouraged to sit on the Board for three, 3-year terms, for a total of 9 years. There are currently 15 board members, but they are hoping to add three more members this year to being the total number to 18, which is the normal number of board members. Applications are currently available and if you are interested, please contact Ray, the Recorder's Office, or myself. Nomination requests were mailed to the various Shrine Temples on January 13th.

Shriners Children's has made a good transition from a

Hospital with patients staying overnight to an outpatient-based Clinic. Surgeries and Post Operative care are performed at Primary Children's Hospital while therapy is provided at the Shriners Children's Clinic.

There is a long-standing relationship between Shriners Children's and the Primary Children's Hospital. Telehealth is being used for patient visits in remote locations. The doctor performing the visit must be licensed in the state where the patient is located. This is allowing remote patients to be seen at an overall lower cost. The expectation is that Telehealth will become more prevalent as our doctors become licensed in other states.

Shriners Children's is continuing to offer the highest level of technology to patients. The 1st Microprocessor Controlled Knee was fitted in 2022. Shriners Children's recently received a donation for the purchase of a "lokomat", a machine that automates gait movements and physical therapy for lower extremities.

The Board is discussing the best way to use the excess capacity at the facility as the clinic moves forward.

Portland Shrine Hospital Report

The 2022 financial and operations reports have been finalized, and Shriners Children's Portland improved in virtually every metric from 2021 to 2022 with the exception of our draw on the endowment. The increase in the draw is due to an increase in the number of international patients treated at the Portland hospital as well as increased costs related to inflation which have impacted virtually every health care facility in the nation.

Adjusted patient days increased by over 20 percent from 2021 and we saw a 30 percent increase in average daily census from 2021. There were nearly 17,000 outpatient encounters in 2022. Our cost per adjusted patient day continues to decline as we become increasingly efficient. The Medford clinic continues to do well and we are pursuing additional clinic locations as well. All this we do to meet the Shrine mission of "More Kids in More Places."

January 2023 has started off strong. Net Patient Revenue increased over 60 percent from January 2022, while inpatient discharges increased over 40 percent and outpatient surgeries and encounters increased over 40 percent and 14 percent, respectively, during the same period.

Our partnership with Providence Health Services continues to expand our services to patients who we may otherwise not have been able to receive care from a Shriners provider. Our physicians cover call for the emergency room 24x7 at Providence, and this coverage resulted in nearly 2,500 clinic visits and over 150 surgeries in 2022.

All of this would be irrelevant if we didn't provide our services with the utmost in quality care and patient experience. In this regard, Portland was once again recognized by Press Ganey with the 2022 Pinnacle of Excellence Award. What a wonderful confirmation not only to what we do but how we do it.

We are still waiting on our survey from The Joint Commission on Accreditation of Health Care Organizations. This survey is part of continuing our Medicare/Medicaid certification. We also continue to work toward getting accredited by the American College of Surgeons.


Winter PNSA




