Shriners Children's Clinic in Salt Lake City Report

The Salt Lake City medical facility is continuing its transition from a Hospital to a Clinic, with some minor changes as a result of the transition. The facility is continuing to run under budget, partially due to open positions that they in the process of trying to fill, with several new employees scheduled for on-boarding in June. Outpatient visits are down slightly in 2023 compared to 2022, but projections are for higher overall patient visits in 2023.

Nathan Clark Director of Development has taken a position at another hospital. Nathan had a major impact on Donor

development during his 5 years at SCC SLC, he will be greatly missed.

The Epic medical record software system went Live in the middle of May, completing a long software implementation process. The new software will allow for faster updates to online patient medical records.

Masking requirements at the facility were dropped last month due to low COVID numbers, only 1 employee tested positive in April, masking will be reinstated if the numbers start to rise again.

Walk for Love sponsorship efforts are underway with a large donation pledged again this year from Big O Tires. The contract with Hogle Zoo has been finalized and the website for registration should be up and running by the end of May. The Utah Grizzlies have recently toured the Salt Lake City facility and have agreed to participate in the Walk for Love event at the Hogle Zoo this year.. Portland Shrine Hospital Report

I recently gave a talk at the Greeters and the Honored Ladies luncheon at El Korah and discovered there are many people who don't know some of the structural parts of serving on a Board of Governors or hospital operations. The following is an overview of what I talked to them about. Some of you will know most of these facts but I know there will be some who don't.

First, each of the hospitals have an appointed Board of Governors. Members of the Board come from the Shrine Centers who are affiliated with that hospital. A Shrine Center may be affiliated with more than one hospital. El Korah Shrine in Boise, for example, is affiliated with both the Portland hospital and the Salt Lake clinic (formerly a hospital). Members of the Shrine Center apply to be on the Board and are interviewed by a Nominating Committee consisting of current Board members. Members are selected based on their professional/occupational backgrounds, and not because they are Past Potentates, current members of the Shrine Center leadership team, or if they are Past Masters or current/past members of the Grand Lodge in their jurisdiction. The names of the recommendations for Board membership are forwarded to the Imperial Board for final approval.

Being a Board member is a substantial commitment. Members are selected for a three year term, and they are expected to serve three terms for a total of 9 years, at which time the Board member can be elected as Emeritus status. Most of the Portland meetings are on-site, requiring travel to/from Portland as well as a hotel room and meals to attend the monthly meetings. Over the 9 year period of service on a Board, a Board member will be expected to attend 108 meetings plus other events such as food caravan, events at the hospital, promoting the hospital at your Shrine, the East-West football games, and so on. As mentioned above, Board members have a variety of backgrounds and experience, and they are selected based on the needs of the Board, but most importantly it is the ability to work together as a team. All of the travel expenses are donated, so there is a substantial financial commitment as well. However, Board members get to visit with patients and families, as well as the staff who give of themselves to take care of the kids.

There are currently two other members of El Korah who are members of the Portland Board (Mike Mastropaolo and Joe Randall) and Ray Westmoreland and Dave Brannen are members of the Salt Lake Board of Governors.

Boards of Governors are charged with Governance versus Management-we don't manage the employees; that is the role of the administrator. We are charged with governance-making sure the "doers" are doing what they are supposed to be doing and that we are complying with state/federal regulations

With the changing health care environment, some of our hospitals in select markets are moving away from the traditional hospital model to alternative care settings. There used to be 22 hospitals. As of now, we have 14 hospitals, 3 former hospitals that have transitioned to Medical Centers, one which is now a clinic (Florida), two which are now outpatient clinics (Springfield, MA and Salt Lake City), and one which is now an ambulatory surgery center (Twin Cities). Additional ambulatory care centers and satellite clinics have been established in Medford, OR, Tijuana, Mexico, Doylestown, PA, Bismarck, ND, Boys Town, NE, Rapid City, SD, and Monterey, Mexico.

The Portland hospital is located on Marquam Hill adjacent to, and physically connected to, Oregon Health Sciences University. We have a terrific relationship with OHSU and utilize their Pediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU) in case some patients need that level of care.

Portland is licensed for 29 beds and has about 300 staff positions. They have an advanced therapy program, a motion lab where kids have sensors attached to various parts of their body and their movement is precisely tracked for diagnostic purposes, a school, x-ray services (including an EOS machine which does a full body x-ray scan and only subjects the patients to about 5% of the normal radiation compared to a CT scan).

There is also a Pediatric Orthotics and Prosthetic Services (POPS) program at the Portland hospital, which creates individualized orthotics and prosthetics for that hospital and several others. They saw 4,542 visits in 2022 and 2,756 devices were delivered last year.

Portland had nearly 800 outpatient surgeries, 17,000 outpatient encounters, and 300 inpatient discharges in 2022. All of this occurred while decreasing the draw on the endowment from about \$13 million per year in 2016 to \$5.5 million in 2021. Our draw on the endowment increased to just over \$8 million in 2022 primarily due to increased staffing costs but also due to an increase in the number of international patients we are seeing which previously were going to Pasadena and Salt Lake.

Portland Shrine Hospital Report (cont.)

The Portland Hospital was a thankful recipient of a very generous donation from Queen Linda Gray of \$250,000 for the purchase of a specialized microscope to be used during surgery. This microscope will allow neurosurgery and very precise incisions to be made to better treat our beloved patients. Sadly, Queen Linda passed away on March 26, one year to the day since she was installed as Queen of Iras Temple No. 40 and one day before the formal presentation by the Daughters of the Nile Foundation for Queen Linda's thoughtful and generous gift.

We now have the ability to input extremely high resolution x-ray images to our 3D printer so that our spine surgeons can actually print the spine of a patient and hold it in his/her hands to identify exactly where to surgically alter the spine. Having this option can reduce the time a patient is in surgery by up to 2 hours!

The complex spine surgeries performed at the Portland hospital sometimes necessitate the insertion of Magnetic Expansion Control (known as MAGEC rods) for scoliosis. They cost nearly \$20,000 each and it takes two-plus several screws at \$700 each. Very few pediatric orthopedic surgery hospitals outside the Shrine system use these because they are so expensive. However, once it is implanted in a patient, as the patient grows, a device applied to the spine externally spins expanding rods that can make adjustments to the rod without surgery. A patient can be out of the hospital in 30 minutes or less instead of going back into surgery to have the rods adjusted to accommodate growth.

The screws used to attach rods to a patient's back must go into a small bone in each vertebrae called a pedicle. If the screws are not accurately placed, it could result in a fracture of the pedicle. Even the best surgeons have about a 20% miss rate on accurately placing the screws. We were able to secure a \$1 million donation to purchase a device called an O-Arm, which accurately positions the screws so that a surgeon consistently achieves a 100% accuracy rate in the placement of the screws. We are one of only a few hospitals in the Shrine system that have an O-Arm.

Portland just completed their survey by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Health Care Organizations. This survey is required to maintain our Medicare/Medicaid certification and licensure. We also continue to work toward getting accredited by the American College of Surgeons.

The Portland Hospital does much more than provide excellent care for kids with orthopedic issues. We also are the only trainer of pediatric orthopedic surgeons for Australian fellows.

We also have a strong research program. There have been multiple patents earned over the years and grants are received from multiple sources to perform research. Recent breakthrough discovery of a Collagen X marker which is a predictor of bone growth, thereby allowing more precise surgical interventions for kids who are preparing to enter or exit a growth spurt.

Daughters of the Nile Charitable Giving Report

Since Daughters of the Nile Foundation was instituted in 2008, Iras Temple No. 40 has given just over one million dollars to assist the Shrine with their hospital system.


