Portland Shrine Hospital Report

As we near the end of 2023, the staff and Board of Governors for the Portland Hospital wish to extend a heartfelt thank you to the wonderful supporters of this hospital. We simply could not do what we do without the unwavering and substantial assistance provided by Nobles, families, donors, and others who share the same dedication and passion for our mission. We also give special thanks to the Daughters of the Nile, who have donated over \$80 million to the Shriners Hospitals, as well as the millions of dollars donated by the Ladies of the Oriental Shrine. May God bless each of you richly now and into the coming year.

The Portland Hospital continues to grow in the number of surgeons, medical staff, and other clinicians such that more space is needed. Inpatient surgeries are down slightly but there continues to be increasing numbers of outpatient surgeries. Net patient revenue is 12.5 percent above 2022 year to date totals and we remain second only to Northern California in this metric.

In addition to seeing patients and performing surgeries, our surgeons are also extremely active publishing articles in medical journals as well as presenting at national association meetings.

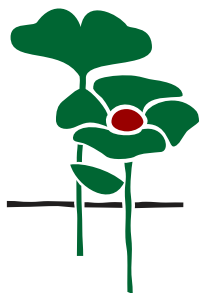

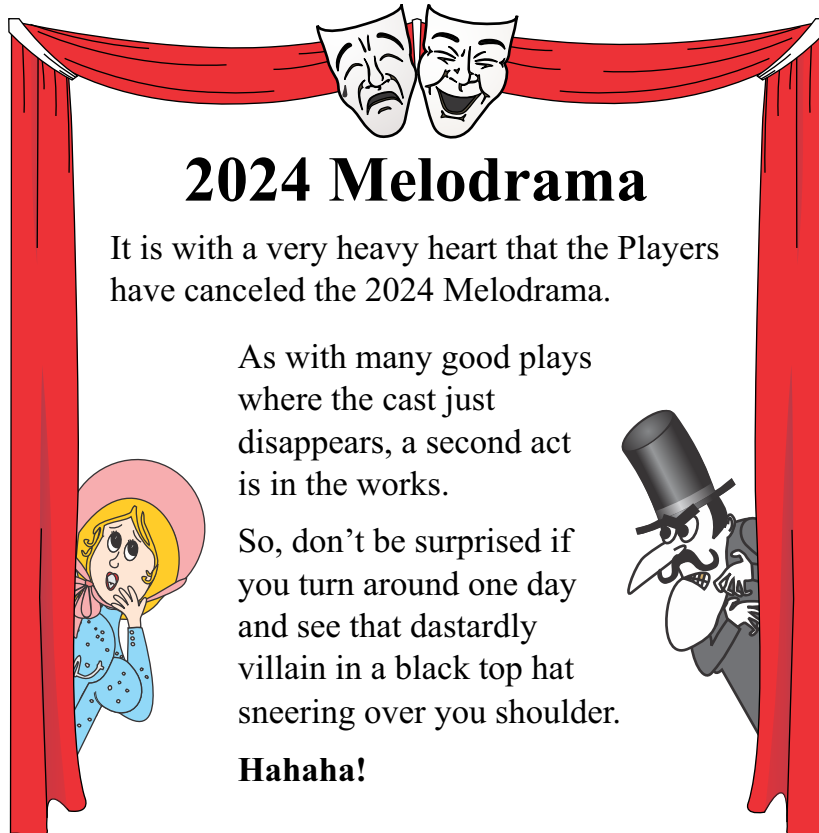

During the peak turnover period after becoming a clinic, they had 17 full time positions that were open and they are now down to 8 open full time positions that still need to be filled, the new recruiter has had a major impact in filling many of the open positions at the clinic.

In January, they will be on-boarding a new Business Manager while they continue to look at opportunities to grow the clinic.

The 2024 Budget has been approved by the Board of Trustees and has given many positive remarks about the Clinic's plans for the future.

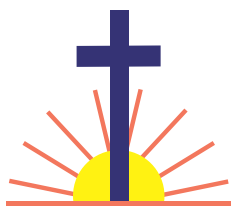

Chaplain's Corner

The phrase “Nothing new under the sun” is usually thought to have come from Shakespeare, but it did not. But how about from King Solomon?

The Preacher, whom we believe was King Solomon, went on to call himself

“the Son of David, King of Jerusalem,” one who has increased in “wisdom more than all who were over Jerusalem before me” and one who has collected many proverbs ([Ecclesiastes 1:1, 16; 12:9](#)). Solomon followed David on the throne in Jerusalem as the only Davidic son to rule over all Israel from that city (1:12). He was the wisest man in the world during his time ([1 Kings 4:29-30](#)) and wrote most of the book of Proverbs ([Proverbs 1:1; 10:1; 25:1](#)). Therefore, we can safely identify Solomon as the *qoheleth* (*The Preacher*) and the author of Ecclesiastes.

As King, he had the opportunity and resources to pursue the rewards of wisdom, pleasure, and work in and of themselves. Yet the world-weary tone of the writing suggests that he looked back on his folly with regret late in life, pointing us to a better, simpler life lived in light of God's direction ([Ecclesiastes 12:13-14](#)).

What is the meaning of Ecclesiastes 12:13-14? Solomon ends with an admonition to trust and obey God because this

makes the most sense for our lives. God will judge all things, both hidden and visible, and He will decide whether it is good or evil, not us.

When all has been heard, the conclusion is quite simple. Fear God and keep His commandments.

I share the following guide for our thoughts and words to better follow God's Laws:

Rumi said: “*Before you speak, let your words pass through three gates: Is it true? Is it necessary? Is it kind?*”

Socrates said something very similar called the triple filter: “*Is it true, is it good, is it useful?*”

So, let's all **T.H.I.N.K.** before we speak:

T ⇒ Is it **T** True?

H ⇒ Is it **H** Helpful?

I ⇒ Is it **I** Inspiring?

N ⇒ Is it **N** Necessary?

K ⇒ Is it **K** Kind?

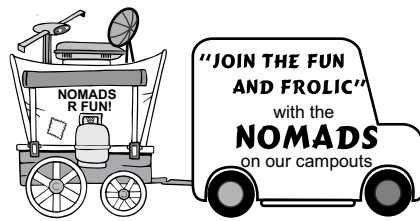
