# **Portland Shrine Hospital Report**

At the December Board meeting and Christmas Party, we recognized Past Grand Master David Fryday for his 9 years of service to the Portland Board of Governors. It is an incredible accomplishment to reach Emeritus status on the Board of Governors and the commitment in time and money is substantial. However, there are few things a Shriner can do which directly impacts the provision of services to the kids we care for more than service on the Board of Governors. Thank you, MWPGM Dave, for your years of devoted service to supporting the management of the Portland Hospital.

At the same time, we welcomed three new Board members who will be starting their service to the Board beginning in January. One of them is Martin Klos, MD, who served on the Board for five years and then had to resign for a couple of years but now is back on our Board. I had the pleasure of working with Dr. Klos in the past and look forward to his insight and contributions to further the mission of the hospital. As we start 2024, I will be starting my ninth and last year of service on the Portland Board and will reach Emeritus status in December 2024. It's hard to believe I have served for eight years already. I wish to extend a special thank you to Illustrious Sir Joe Randall, who was Potentate of El Korah when I first applied to be on the Board. His leadership and support helped me start on a path that I have thoroughly enjoyed, including two years as Vice Chairman and two years as Chairman of the Board. Thank you, Joe!

As we finish 2023, the Portland Hospital has exceeded budget on all metrics, although inpatient discharges may be slightly less than budget. Our net patient revenue continues to be second only to Northern California but our draw on the endowment continues to be one of the lowest in the system.

On February 24, 2024, the Portland Hospital will be celebrating its "Party of the Century-Putting Patients First for Over 100 Years" in a gala event. Tickets are now available and the information on this event is shown below.

If anyone is interested in receiving the 2022 Outcomes book, please let me know and I will send you a digital copy. We also have the 2023 Portland Fraternal Toolkit available to help local Shrine Centers get more involved in the hospital. # **Fund Raising Committee**

As I was cleaning out the Potentate Office in the old El Korah Shrine, I found a paper survey that was collected in 2013, when Ill Sir Ron Lester was Potentate. This begged the question: What does our Membership think about the El Korah Organization in 2023?

So, the Fundraising Committee decided that it was time to check in again with the membership to gain some insight into the direction that they want to move. With the assistance of Nora Carpenter, who owns a copy of Survey Monkey which is a tool used to develop, track and report the survey results, we created a survey for the Nobility. It was sent out in October via the Desert Dust and Constant Contact.

As of December 19th, 77 responses were submitted from our roughly 450 members. This represents a 17% response rate, which sounds low but is actually a pretty good sample rate in the world of surveys.

Here is a quick summary of the survey results:

- *Question 1: How long have you been a Shriner?* Answers ranged from 3 years to 66 years with people scattered through the spectrum.
- *Question 2: How often do you visit El Korah each year?* 16% said never, 17% said 6 to 10 times, 31% said more then 10 times, and 36% said 1 to 5 times.
- *Questions 3 & 4: Are you a member of Scottish Rite or York Rite?* 70% Scottish Rite, 30 % York Rite, some belong to both organizations.
- *Question 5: Why did you join the Shriners?* Most selected more than one response. 52% said because of friends, 52% said to support the hospitals, 49% said to continue my Masonic journey, and 45% family legacy.
- *Question 6: What keeps you as a member?* 68% said the hospitals, 67% said the people, 57% said the mission, 48% said Clubs and Units involvement, 38% said social events, 12% said family ties.
- *Questions 7 & 8: Have you ever been involved in a Unit?* 79% said Yes, with the largest number of respondents naming the Greeters. All Units were named.
- Question 9: Do you consider yourself an active member of El Korah? 65% said Yes, 35% said No.
- *Question 10: How far do you live from El Korah?* Four respondents live over 1,000 miles away, several are in Eastern Idaho, but most are within a 100 miles.

*Question 11: How do you receive communication from El Korah?* Most respondents named the Desert Dust and/or Constant Contact with the El Korah web page being third. Word of mouth and Unit information was occasionally mentioned.

- Question 12: Regarding the amount of communication from El Korah? 67% said it is about right, 32% said there is not enough, 1% said there is too much.
- *Question 13: How many Stated meetings did you attend this year?* 50% said none, 50% said between one and all meetings.
- *Question 14: If you didn't attend any Stated meetings, why?* These written responses need further review.
- Question 15: Will you be attending the December Stated Meeting? 48% said Yes, 52% said No.
- *Question 16: Are you interested in becoming more involved in El Korah?* 19% said Yes, 74% said No, 7% said they wanted more information.
- Questions 17, 18, 19 and 20 asked you to rate 1) how well the Divan is managing El Korah, 2) how well you use your Shrine membership, 3) how comfortable you feel when attending events, and 4) the image of El Korah in the community. All responses were favorable, but further review is needed to determine meaningful results.
- Questions 21 & 22 asked for written responses about 1) image of El Korah in the community and 2) forming new social groups. These responses need further review.
- Question 23: Do you have interest in helping El Korah fundraising activities? 71% said Yes to Circus, 59% said Yes to Sportsman's Classic, 38% said Yes to Cornhole Tournament.
- *Question 24: Are you interested in forming a Shrine Club?* 68% said No, 32% said Yes.
- Question 25: Has the sale of the El Korah Shrine building impacted your membership? 73% said No, 27% said Yes.
- Question 26 asked for comments directed to El Korah *leadership*. These responses need further review.

The Fundraising Committee thanks the Nobility for taking the time to participate in this important survey. It is through processes like this that El Korah leadership learns about and understands your thoughts and desires.

**NOTE.** Questions that included comments or additional information will require more time for the Divan to review and evaluate, but the committee wanted to share the bulk of the survey results as soon as possible.

Only 500 of these beautiful coins have been created and will be offered for sale to the Nobility and the general public for \$20.00 dollars each.


Anyone can own one of these keepsakes!
