Portland Shrine Hospital Report

Your Portland Shrine Hospital followed a record-setting 2023 with a slightly softer start in 2024 primarily due to some significant snow events in January which resulted in several cancellations. Accordingly, the January 2024 numbers show slightly less revenue than budget but our average draw on the endowment per patient is now the lowest it has ever been.

For the year ending 2023, however, net patient revenue has had a 56 percent increase over the past five years. We've had nearly a 50 percent increase in unique patients over the last 6 years and are in the top 5 percent of all hospitals in patient satisfaction as measured by Press Ganey.

On February 24, 2024, the Portland Hospital celebrated its "Party of the Century-Putting Patients First for Over 100 Years" in a gala event held at the Hilton Vancouver. The party was very well attended and, while the total raised at this event hasn't been finalized, it is expected we will have raised over \$100,000 for the night.

If you are ready to head to Seattle for some play at the Nile Shrine golf course, you'll get your chance on May 17, when the 2024 Shriners Children's Northwest Classic Golf Tournament will be held there in Mountlake Terrace, Washington. The cost is \$150 per player with a 4 person team scramble format. Virtually all of the tournament proceeds go to support the Portland and Spokane Shrine hospitals.

If anyone has any questions about the Portland Hospital, please reach out to Joe Randall or I via text, email, or phone. We are always willing to provide any additional information you may have regarding the Portland Hospital. At the end of this year, I will be leaving the Board after 9 years of service. 

Aretha Franklin, Ruth Bader Ginsburg, Rita Moreno, Queen Elizabeth II, Malala Yousafzai. Michelle Kwan, Amelia Earhart, Halle Berry, Lucille Ball, Maya Angelo, Rosa Parks, x Vera Wang, Marie Curie, Elizabeth Taylor, Serena Williams, Jane Austen, Sally Ride, Susan B. Anthony, Mother Teresa

President Jimmy Carter's Message to the nation designating March 2-8, 1980 as National Women's History Week.

"From the first settlers who came to our shores, from the first American Indian families who befriended them, men and women have worked together to build this nation. Too often the women were unsung and sometimes their contributions went unnoticed. But the achievements, leadership, courage, strength, and love of the women who built America were as vital as that of the men whose names we know so well."

As Dr. Gerda Lerner has noted, "Women's History is Women's Right." – It is an essential and indispensable heritage from which we can draw pride, comfort, courage, and long-range vision."

I ask my fellow Americans to recognize this heritage with appropriate activities during National Women's History Week, March 2-8, 1980.

I urge libraries, schools, and community organizations to focus their observances on the leaders who struggled for equality — Susan B. Anthony, Sojourner Truth, Lucy Stone, Lucretia Mott, Elizabeth Cady Stanton, Harriet Tubman, and Alice Paul.

Understanding the true history of our country will help us to comprehend the need for full equality under the law for all our people.

This goal can be achieved by ratifying the 27th Amendment to the United States Constitution, which states that "Equality of Rights under the Law shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any state on account of sex."

As Shriners and Masons, recall the Four Cardinal virtues we are taught, Temperance, Fortitude, Prudence, and Justice. From a Florida Lodge here are some thoughts on Justice:

For Masons, Justice is that standard or boundary of right which enables us to render to every man his just due without distinction. Justice must always dictate fairness, honesty, morality, and neutrality in the treatment of all of mankind, more especially a Brother Mason. The exercise of this virtue incites us to act toward others in a manner that we wish they would act toward us. Sound familiar? Love your neighbor as yourself.

I think the use of the word Mankind is inclusive to all humanity, especially our Ladies.

A young mother in Mazatlan who helps us while there on vacation has a nightly ritual with her young daughter with the use of positive affirmation. Before prayer she is told to say "I am loved, I am strong, I am smart, I am Happy".

Think how you could use this in your life,


