## Chaplain's Corner

Upon reviewing for my notes for my Scottish Rite educational lesson on April 3rd, which is the Remembrance Ceremony for the Brethren passed this last year, I offer the following . . .

Albert Pike's writings on the 18th Degree, Knight Rose Croix speaks of the Universalities of our Masonic Work. Each belief system has its own words, in India (Chrishna), China (Kioun-tse), Egypt (Har-Oeri), Plato (Love), Jesus with his last commandment to Love one another.

Pike relates what all belief systems worldwide have in common: belief in a Supreme Being and the Soul's Immortality.

What caught my interest was the connection to freedom of thought for each to find their interpretation and the connection of freedom related to Remembrance.

Moses played a major role in this as we know his story about telling the Pharaoh to let my people go and then the Egyptians suffering many plagues with the last one being related to the Passover. The Israelites marked their door with the blood of a lamb so the destroying Angel would pass over their household while the Egyptians lost their 1st born. This resulted in their release from slavery and a hasty exit from

Egypt, with no time for their bread to rise. Hence the UNLEVEN Bread.

Now, fast forward to Holy Thursday where Christ, knowing of his coming sacrifice, calls the Disciples on the evening of the Passover feast, the Remembrance of the Freedom from Egypt. He knew His time was near, that he would be betrayed, humiliated, and crucified in a few hours. Despite this knowledge, He loved and taught love as the one absolute rule that can measure life. With Bread and Wine as symbols of his Body and Blood, He said to do this in Remembrance of Me.

The Great Master matched His words to acts. He knelt before each of his Disciples and washed the feet of each as an act of total humility and love. In this symbolic act of self-sacrifice and service, the message took on a practical form giving them a new Commandment:

*"A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another"* (John 13:34).

These are the words spoken by the Master of Nazareth as He broke bread with His Disciples at the Last Supper. They are simple words. Yet they express the most sublime truth: all men are brothers.

We share one origin and one common obligation. The Great Teacher in this one Mandatum Novum, or New Commandment, summarized the highest wisdom of all ages.

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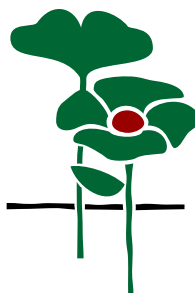
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## Greeters

## Salt Lake Shriners Children's Clinic

The Shriners Children's Clinic in Salt Lake City is committed to its mission of providing "The Best Care Anywhere" and "Caring for More Kids in More Places."

The clinic will celebrate a century of service with a gala event on May 10th at the Eccles Alumni House. It will serve as a fundraising event with tickets priced at \$250 per person. El Korah has been allocated 8 seats, but additional seats are available because some Temples have not chosen to reserve their allotment. Twelve individuals from El Korah are already planning to attend.

The Walk for Love will be Saturday, September 20th at the Hogle Zoo in Salt Lake. The clinic is working to make this another gala celebration for the 100-year anniversary of the medical facility. We hope to see a strong turnout from El Korah and the Daughters of the Nile. Please let me know if you are interested in attending.

The Philanthropy Department has raised 17.4% of its 2025 goal of \$4.75 million.

In December, a total of 74 clinics were conducted, resulting in 721 unique patient visits including 31 surgical procedures, 4 infusions, 593 therapy sessions, 20 motion analysis sessions, and 31 Locomat sessions. The Orthotics and Prosthetics Department delivered a total of 256 devices including 241 orthotic devices and 11 prosthetics. Furthermore, the wheelchair department tended to 156 wheelchairs.

In January, Recreational Therapy expanded beyond traditional therapy groups to include several winter activities:

- Skiing with Wasatch Adaptive Sports
- Snowshoeing with Wasatch Adaptive Sports
- Sledding at Gateway Parks

# The Importance of Positive Communication to Children with Disabilities

## The Power of Language

Our word choices have a tremendous impact on those around us. Children, especially, are deeply influenced by the language surrounding them – who they become is based on who they are learning to be. The staff of Shriners Hospitals for Children® understands the importance of building confidence and self-esteem in our patients at an early age. Our staff recognizes that while working with children with disabilities, it is imperative to help them develop a strong positive attitude so they will have the confidence to pursue their dreams. To accomplish this, being mindful of the effect language has on children is critical.

Two essential points in using communication as affirmation are accurate wording and people-first language. Always remember to use language that encourages, rather than discourages, the individual. When referring to those with a disability, please remember to **avoid labels with a negative connotation**, such as:

- crippled
- handicapped
- lame
- deformed
- » **The preferred word choice is usually:**
  - disability
  - disabled
  - the actual term involved, such as, cerebral palsy or muscular dystrophy

## People with Disabilities are People First

The second key element of communicating with people with disabilities is the need to use “people-first language,” where the person is the important element, rather than the disability.

For example, try using phrases such as “a person *with* cerebral palsy” or “a person *who uses* a prosthetic arm,” rather than defining them by the disability itself.

It is also important to recognize that people are individuals, and to **avoid lumping those with disabilities together into one group**, like “the disabled,” “the spinal cord injured,” or to refer to “all people with X.”

» Another important aspect of using people-first language is to **avoid negative descriptive phrases and terms**, such as:

- confined to a wheelchair
- wheelchair bound
- victim stricken with
- suffering

Instead, try saying a person “uses a wheelchair,” or “has cerebral palsy.”



*“We must take language very seriously. The feeling I have is that language is always a reflection of attitude. With the advancement of the disability movement, you see a change in language.” – Michael Masutha*

Also avoid **value-laden words and phrases**, whether negative or positive, because even seemingly positive labels such as “courageous” and “inspirational” can be burdensome to a child, setting unnecessary high expectations, that may be hard to maintain.

As part of using people-first language, it is also imperative to not define people by their disabilities. This is accomplished by **emphasizing abilities, not limitations**.

» For instance:

- Say: “Darlene is an excellent writer,” rather than, “Despite her disability, Darlene is an excellent writer.”
- Say, “Johnny is a child with a disability,” instead of the defining, “Johnny is a *disabled child*.”

Being mindful of preferred disability terminology and using people-first language whenever possible will help children with disabilities become more confident and able to become successful, productive adults.



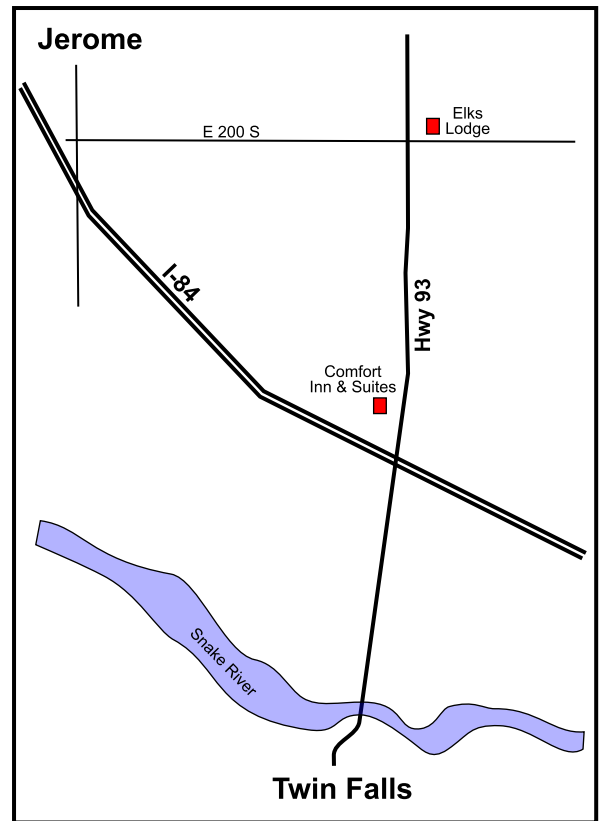

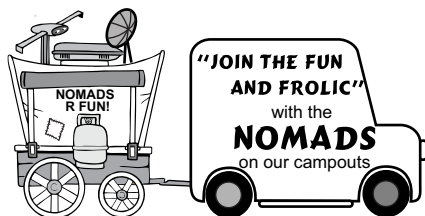
We have initiated eighteen fabulous new members this year who are already becoming actively involved in our events.
