## Salt Lake Shriners Children's Clinic

The Shriners Children's Clinic in Salt Lake City is committed to its mission of providing "The Best Care Anywhere" and "Caring for More Kids in More Places."

The Walk for Love is scheduled for September 20th at the Hogle Zoo in Salt Lake City. Meeka Pederson is compiling a list of attendees and has provided small save-the-date forms with information about a recommended hotel for the event. If you would like one of these forms, please let me know. Meeka and I are eager to gather a group from our area to represent the El Korah Shriners and the Daughters of the Nile Iras Temple #40 at this event.

As of the end of June, the Philanthropy Department has raised 52.2% of its \$4,750,000 goal for 2025.

In June, 80 clinics were held over 21 available clinic days, resulting in 866 individual patient visits. The month included 59 surgical procedures and 4 infusions, along with 613 therapy sessions and 36 motion analysis sessions. The Orthotics and Prosthetics Department successfully delivered 356 orthotic devices and 17 prosthetics, totaling 373 devices. Additionally, the wheelchair department attended to 153 wheelchairs throughout the month.

Wayne Foster worked tirelessly to support our hospitality suite and share my message.

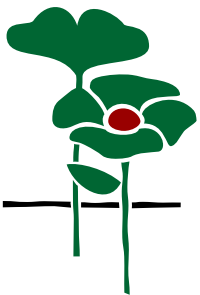

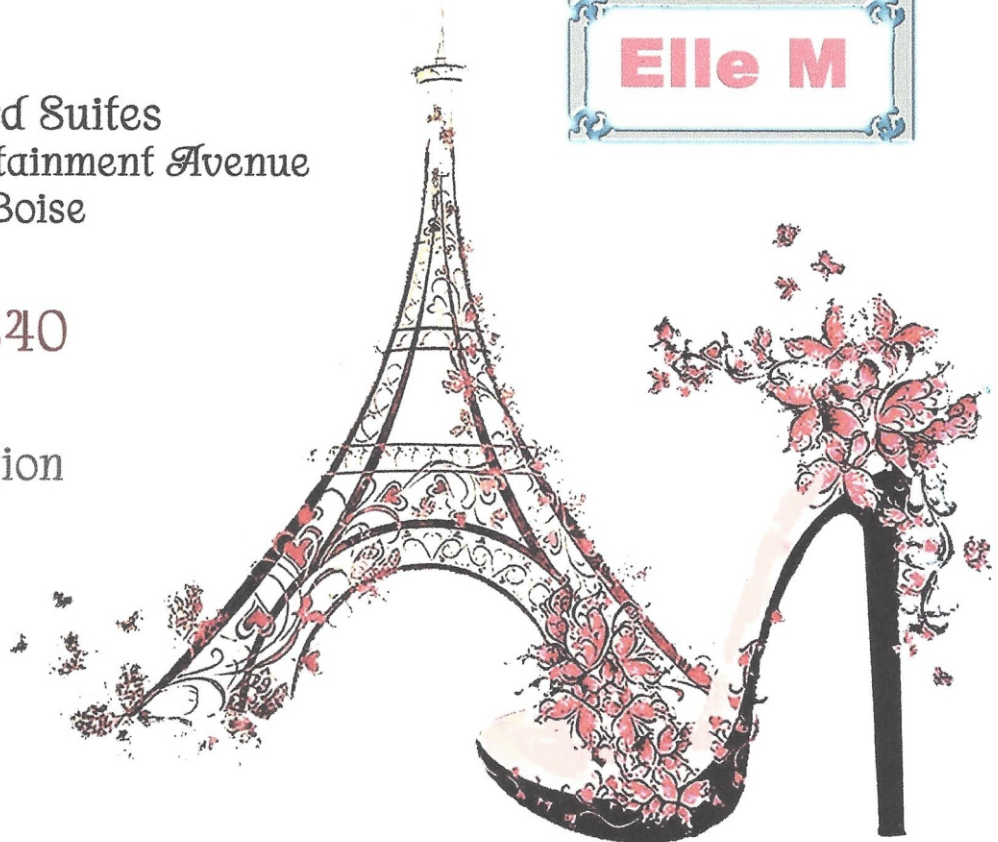
