Greetings Brethern.

Last night (Saturday May 16th at Church at St. Michael's) as portion of the liturgy was that He is the God of Truth, which brought what we teach to our Entered Apprentice candidates. TRUTH is the foundation of every virtue and inspires me to

focus on the lessons of the four cardinal virtues

In the lecture of the Entered Apprentice degree, there is a section that is written out and can be shared. The history and background for these virtues are very old and have been the foundation of right living.

Pages 8-9 of the May/June 2026 Scottish Rite Journal relates the Masonic writing of Rudyard Kipling. You can access this article online by typing in Scottish Rite Journal and select the date mentioned.

In our Idaho Monitor the virtues are Temperance, Fortitude, Prudence and Justice. I have no idea why they are listed in that order, Many authors call for Prudence to be the Queen of the virtues and the first to contemplate and study. Here we teach the candidate to regulate his life and actions by the dictation of REASON, which I believe is already programmed in our mind by the Great Architect. Focusing on this virtue allows us to reflect on the other virtues and will determine our present and future Happiness.

TEMPERANCE gives us the resolve to remember that we have boundaries keeping our thoughts and actions in a positive direction, letting us avoid excess and anger that leads us astray.

FORTITUDE by some authors relates this virtue to courage. The practice of this virtue enables us to assist Brothers and family while disregarding perils or danger.

PRUDENCE, as mentioned, is where we wisely judge and prudentially determine on all acts in lodge and in our daily lives and being sure our last virtue, JUSTICE insures that the three Tenets of our Craft, Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth are maintained in their highest form, as mentioned in our Monitor .JUSTICE is the very cement and support of civil society.

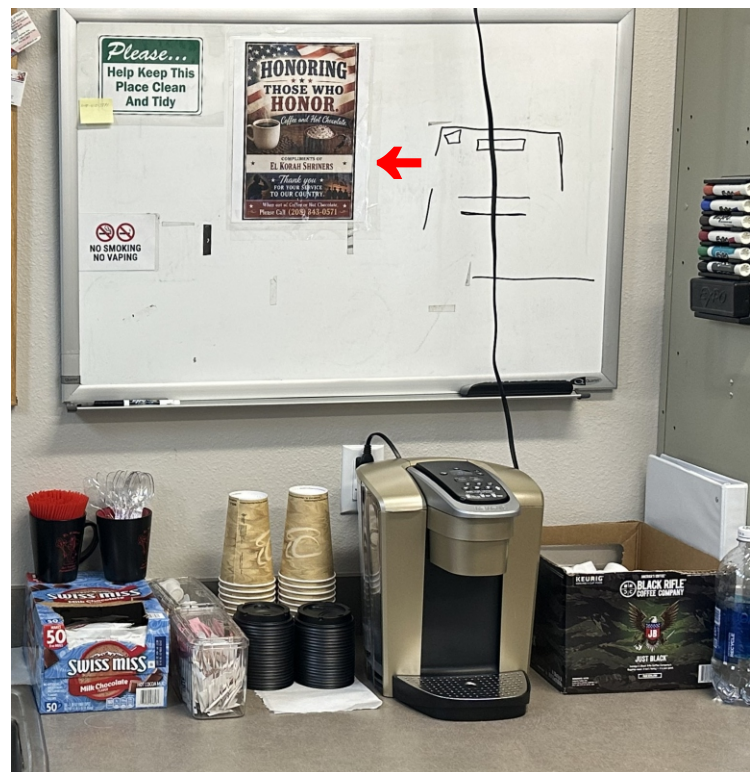
Honoring those that Honor

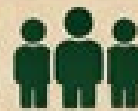

Organizations such as Shriners Children's Hospital and the Shriners Hospital Travel Fund benefit from 501(c)(3) status, which allows companies and community members to make tax-deductible donations. As the number of 501(c)(3) organizations in Idaho continues to grow, competition for charitable funding has become more intense. This year, KTVB 7 Cares raised about five million dollars, but because the Shriners Children's Hospital and the Shriners Hospital Travel Fund were not registered, they were not included.

The Challenge for El Korah Shrine

So, what is a smaller 503(c)(10) not-for-profit such as El Korah Shrine to do? We could do nothing and slowly fade away, leaving people to say, "The Shriners were such a good group—what happened to them?" Or we can work together to build an organization that people want to join, support, and participate in. We cannot afford to sit back and complain about how things are. We all need to stay actively involved, and many of us already are.

Upper Snake River Shrine Club/Tin Lizzie Unit Another Tin Lizzie Story — “The Red and Black One”

Last month, the Upper Snake River Shrine Club shared the story of the red fire truck known as the “Basket Case.” This month, we thought we'd share the story of another parade car being brought back to parade condition — a project that demanded far more than a simple tune-up.

At first glance, the little parade car appeared to be in decent shape. The body itself had been well preserved over the years, retaining much of its classic character and charm. But beneath the surface, the car suffered from years of wear, broken components, and missing parts — many of which are no longer available anywhere.

That meant the restoration had to rely on something even more valuable than replacement parts: ingenuity.

This little car has simply become known as the “Red and Black One” due to its unique color scheme. The project has required extensive metal fabrication, welding, and custom tube bending to recreate components that could not be purchased or salvaged. Nearly every missing detail had to be designed and built by hand.

Among the most challenging pieces were the bumpers, windshield frame, and headlights. Each component had to match the vintage appearance of the original Tin Lizzie while also being durable enough for parade duty.

The handcrafted bumpers were heated and bent from bar stock, while the windshield frame required compound bends, twists, and careful forming to capture the car's classic profile. The headlights presented perhaps the most creative challenge of all.



Take a close look and you may notice a clever bit of ingenuity hidden in plain sight: the headlights were fabricated using Bush's Baked Beans cans. With a little imagination and a lot of craftsmanship, ordinary cans were transformed into convincing vintage-style headlights that perfectly fit the spirit of the project.

What could have become an abandoned relic is now once again preparing to bring smiles to parade crowds and continue a cherished tradition.

For the Tin Lizzie drivers I have come to know, these little cars are more than just parade vehicles. They are symbols of fellowship, volunteerism, and the pride that comes from preserving a piece of history with their own hands. In some cases, these cars have even been handed down from father to son, making them especially meaningful to the Shriners who continue the tradition.

The Summer session of Pacific North\west Shrine Association (PNSA) will be held in Kimberley, BC from July 29th through August 2nd.

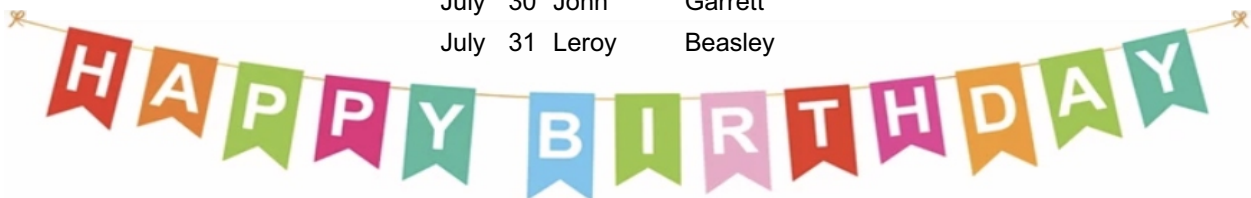
Our next Greeters Dinner and Meeting will be held on Friday, September 4th, the Boise Masonic Center - Westgate at 6:00 pm.
